In opening the meeting the Chair was saddened to report on the recent death of Paul Cooper. Members of the Committee paid tribute to his dedication to the Hyde War Memorial Trust and more recently to Werneth Low Country Park Joint Management Committee. Thoughts were with his family at this sad time.

A minutes silence was held in his memory.

10. MINUTES

The Minutes of the previous meeting of the Werneth Low Country Park Joint Management Committee held on 24 July 2017 were approved as a correct record.

11. GREENSPACE DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

The Greenspace Development Officer submitted a report informing members of the activities undertaken within the Country Park since the last meeting of the Joint Management Committee held on 24 July 2017.

The report outlined the following:-

Maintenance of Sites;

- Environmental Stewardship Higher Level Agreement 2010-2020 Update;
- Public Events;
- Werneth Low Country Park Greenspace Volunteer Service;
- Visitors 2017; and,
- Wildlife Nature Conservation.

With regards to Maintenance of Sites, the summer grass cutting programme had been completed by the end of September, including the area surrounding Lower Higham Visitor Centre, car parks, access points, picnic areas and strips along footpaths. The cost of the programme was funded by Tameside Council. It was reported that Council engineers had repaired two sections of tarmac on the main drive at Lower Higham Visitor Centre.

The report included attendance at public events for the Country Park's summer 2017 programme and details of the 2017/2018 winter/spring programme. Visitor monitoring data for 2017 was also provided.

It was reported that since the last meeting of the Joint Management Committee volunteers had held four meetings and at their October meeting had agreed the programme of works to be undertaken during winter and spring 2017/18. It was confirmed that there were 18 members in the volunteer service at present, two of whom were skilled in the art of hedge-laying. One volunteer had re-laid 200 metres of hedgerow during the autumn near Higham Lane in Shepley' Meadow. The project had been funded by Heritage Lottery and jointly managed with Manchester City of Trees. It was anticipated that the project would achieve £5.00 a metre and would be completed by Christmas. Hedgerows were an important part of nature conservation and provided boundary habitats for wildlife in addition to complimenting the surrounding landscape.

Members enquired how volunteers were recruited. It was confirmed that the most effective method was word of mouth, however, advertising on the Council's website and social media was also utilised. Members suggested displaying information on how to volunteer in the Visitor Centre.

The Committee was advised that the exhibition in the Visitor Centre had been updated for Remembrance Day and the data had been used to suggest the naming of a new street in Tameside (as per the Leader's Pledges) after one of the men who had fallen during the Somme.

The Greenspace Development Officer sadly informed the Committee about the death of Dr John Smith who was one of the original signatories of Werneth Low Country Park. Members of the Committee expressed their condolences.

Members of the Committee commented that they would like to be kept informed of the progress of the renewal of the 1979 agreement, which was due to expire in 2020. The Greenspace Development Manager advised that updates would be brought to future meetings of the Joint Management Committee.

1. MAINTENANCE OF SITES

1.1 The summer grass cutting programme for 2018 is due to start the beginning of April. The programme includes: the grass cutting of the Lower Higham Visitor Centre area, car parks, access points, picnic areas and strips along footpaths. The cost of this programme of maintenance is paid by Tameside Council.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP - HIGHER LEVEL AGREEMENT 2010 - 2020 UPDATE

- 2.1 Environmental Stewardship agreements have five primary objectives:-
 - Wildlife conservation
 - Maintenance and enhancement of landscape quality and character
 - Natural resource protection
 - Protection of the historic environment: and
 - Promotion of public access and understanding of the countryside

Environmental Stewardship – Higher Level agreements are only suitable for land that is of "significant environmental interest".

- 2.2 Since the agreement started in January 2010 the Country Park has received in total £39,158 of grant income from Natural England.
- 2.3 At the time of this report the Country Park is compliant with all aspects of this agriagreement.

3. PUBLIC EVENTS

3.1. The winter/spring 2017 to 2018 programme of events at Werneth Low Country Park is as follows:-

3.2 The summer 2018 programme of public events is currently being planned, which will include Flora Walks, a History Walk, a Poetry Walk and an all-day ramble to Cown Edge. All the events will be included in Tameside's Greenspace publications and social media platforms.

4. WERNETH LOW COUNTRY PARK GREENSPACE VOLUNTEER SERVICE

4.1 Since the last meeting of the Country Park Joint Management Committee the volunteers have held 3 meetings. The volunteers assist the Greenspace Development Officer with public events, the maintenance and general upkeep of sites, and staffing the visitor centre. There are at present 15 members in the volunteer service.

- 4.2 At the October 2017 meeting of the Country Park Greenspace Volunteer Service the Volunteers agreed the major projects to be undertaken during winter and spring 2017/2018. The project list of works with update of progress can be found in **Appendix 1**.
- 4.3 Volunteer Mike Kelly has completed re-laying 200 metres of hedgerow near Higham Lane in Shepley's Meadow. This project is Heritage Lottery funded and jointly managed with Woodland Officer, Andy Long from Manchester City of Trees. We expect to receive £5.00 per metre for the completed project.
- 4.4 In addition to the hedhelaying in Shepley's Meadow, Volunteer Mike Kelly is now laying a further 38 metres of hedgerow at Ash Cottage on Higham Lane. This project has also been included in the submission to the Heritage Lottery Fund.
- 4.5 On Monday 5 February the Country Park Volunteer Service celebrated their 30th Annual General Meeting. Since 1988 the volunteers have played a major and significant role in the stewardship and care of the Country Park. Their work, focusing right across the whole management spectrum of the conservation of Werneth Low, has saved the Management Committee tens of thousands of pounds, provided a viable means of engaging the local and wider community and ensured the Country Park is fit for purpose.

5. REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY 2017

5.1 On Sunday 12 November 2017 the annual Service of Remembrance was held at the Cenotaph on Werneth Low. The commemoration was supported and attended by over 500 people and is the most important occasion in the Country Park's calendar of events.

6. THE LOWER HIGHAM VISITOR CENTRE

- 6.1 Lauren Gradwell, The Hyde War Memorial Trust's archivist, has installed a new exhibition covering all the years of The Great War 1914 1919 in the visitor centre. The exhibition has raised much interest especially the poignant feature of young men, from the Ashton Brothers Training Corps, using Werneth Low as a training ground prior to joining the armed services.
- 6.2 On 23 January we welcomed 30 Year 4 children from Holy Trinity School Gee Cross to the Visitor Centre. The children learnt about the Country Park, in particular the history of the purchase of the land and farm in memory of the 710 servicemen from Hyde, Gee Cross and Newton killed in The Great War.
- 6.3 Arrangements are well underway for the 11th Alder School Cross Country Run around Werneth Low Country Park. This annual event raises thousands of pounds for The Christie Hospital in Manchester and is a great link between our local schools and the Country Park.

8. WILDLIFE NATURE CONSERVATION

8.1 Over the winter there has been a small flock of Bullfinches in residence around the gardens at Lower Higham. Feeding off Sunflower seeds on the bird table these handsome finches are normally seen at lower locations than Werneth Low. The collective noun for a group of Bullfinches is: a bellowing, which may be linked to their piping call that can be heard at no small distance.
