3. ACRE STREET MINI MARKET, 21 ACRE STREET, DENTON

The Assistant Director of Operations and Neighbourhoods submitted a report requesting that the Panel determine a premises licence application for Acre Street Mini Market, 21 Acre Street, Denton under Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

The Panel considered the information that had been submitted and heard from the Regulatory Services Manager who advised that the Licensing Authority had received a premises licence application for Acre Street Mini Market seeking authorisation for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises from 11:00 – 22:00 Sunday to Thursday and 11:00 – 22:30 on Friday and Saturday. Acre Street Mini Market was a former licensed premises and the licence had been held by the applicant's spouse. Following a history of non-compliance the licence had been revoked by the Speaker's Panel (Liquor Licensing) on 27 September 2017. Representations had been received against the application from Tameside MBC Licensing Authority, Tameside MBC Trading Standards and Greater Manchester Police in their role as a responsible authority.

The applicant and their representative attended the hearing and addressed the Panel. Following their case they answered questions from the Panel.

The three representatives then addressed the Panel in turn and answered questions from the Panel.

At this juncture the applicant, their representative, the Regulatory Services Manager and the three representatives from the responsible authorities left the meeting whilst the Panel deliberated the application. The Solicitor to the Panel and the Senior Democratic Services Officer remained in the meeting to give legal and procedural advice and took no part in the decision making process.

The Panel considered the evidence that had been submitted by all parties, the applicant's case, the representations, questions and answers. In determining the application the Panel had to take such steps in accordance with Section 18 of the Licensing Act 2003 as it considered appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

The Panel did not have sufficient confidence from what they had heard that the applicant had demonstrated the ability at this moment in time to meet the licensing objectives required under the Licensing Act 2003. The evidence that was presented demonstrated a lack of understanding of the licensing requirements and objectives. Therefore they determined that the application for a premises licence in respect of Acre Street Mini Market, 21 Acre Street, Denton be refused.

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1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby an application can be made to the Licensing Authority for a premises licence.
- 1.2 Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that where relevant representations are made in respect of such an application, the authority must:-
 - (a) hold a hearing to consider them, unless the authority, the applicant and each person who has made such representations agree that a hearing is unnecessary, and
 - (b) having regard to the representations, take such steps as mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 1.3 The steps mentioned in subsection (4) are:-
 - (a) to grant the licence subject to -
 - (i) such conditions that the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and
 - (ii) current mandatory conditions;
 - (b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
 - (c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the premises supervisor;
 - (d) to reject the application.

2. REPORT

- 2.1 On 23 March 2017 the Licensing Office received an application from Mr Mohammed Hayder Miah for a premises licence for 57-59 Armadale Road, Dukinfield, SK16 4BD. The application received one representation from GMP. The application went before the Licensing Panel on 16 May 2017 and was subsequently refused on the grounds of the applicant being unable to promote the Licensing Objectives. The decision letter from this hearing can be seen at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.2 On 6 July 2018 the Licensing Office received for a second time an application for 57-59 Armadale Road, Dukinfield, on this occasion in the name of Miah's Mini Market Limited. A copy of this application can be seen at **Appendix 2**. The Company was incorporated on 27 June 2018. The only Director is Mr Mohammed Hayder Miah, who is also the Designated Premises Supervisor proposed in the application.
- 2.3 Mr Mohammed Hayder Miah currently operates a business at 53 Armadale Road, Dukinfield. Mr Miah is seeking to close these premises and move the business to larger premises at 57-59 Armadale Road, Dukinfield. A copy of the Premises Licence relating to 53 Armadale Road, Dukinfield (PL0642) can be seen at **Appendix 3**.

3. REPRESENTATIONS & EVIDENCE SUBMITTED

- 3.1 A representation has been received from PC Mark Casey on behalf of Greater Manchester Police. His representation can be seen at **Appendix 4**.
