Procurement at TMBC

Key stats

- Spend over £500m per annum on service delivery
- £300m spent with third party suppliers
- 4,000 suppliers on our creditors system
- 100,000 + transactions per annum





Procurement before September 2018

- There was insufficient strategic overview of spend.
- The contracts register was incomplete, therefore significant savings opportunities have been missed.
- There was limited social value and local market spend;
- There was little early market engagement and supplier support.
- Non-experts were leading often complex procurements, resulting in risks and poor use of resources.
- Spending was being incurred without procurement.





Pre 2018 continued

- The routes to market chosen may not have being giving the best options to the Council.
- A number of expired contracts existed.
- Collaboration opportunities were not being maximised.
- There was a fire fighting approach that is not strategic or proactive.
- Poor/weak contract management.
- Risk of non-compliance with our own Corporate Procurement Rules (CPRs) as well as serious risk of breach of Public Contract Regulations 2015





Shared Service with STAR Procurement

- October 2017 review of procurement commissioned.
- January 2018 review reported to AD Finance, major investment required.
- June 2018 options paper and business case developed.
- July 2018 Executive Cabinet agreed to enter into shared service with STAR procurement.
- September 2018 Shared Service entered into with STAR procurement.



Business Case for Shared Service

- HM Treasury 5 case model
- 5 options considered
 - a)Do nothing
 - b)Resource our own Procurement Team
 - c) Centralise the Procurement function and resource
 - d)Outsource to the Private Sector
 - e)Find a Public Sector Partner





STAR Procurement

- Shared Procurement Service between Rochdale, Stockport, Tameside and Trafford Councils.
- Hosted by Trafford.
- Made significant savings for original partner members of over £20m since 2015/16, or >£1m per Council per year.
- Significant contribution to savings targets.
- Significant improvement in compliance.


