1. MAINTENANCE OF SITES

- 1.1 The summer grass cutting programme for 2018 has been completed. The programme included: the grass cutting of the Lower Higham Visitor Centre area, car parks, access points, picnic areas and strips along footpaths. The cost of this programme of maintenance is paid by Tameside Council.
- 1.2 We have now received quotations from our contractors in regards to a small number of footpath repair projects. The projects and costs are as follows:-
 - Resurfacing the footpath from Lower Higham to the Hackingknife: Cost: £6,384.
 - Resurfacing the footpath from the Cenotaph across Hackingknife Meadow: Cost: £3.327.
- 1.3 Recently completed projects include the following:-
 - Reforming ditches along Riding Track alongside Golf Course: Cost: £300.
 - Repairing 30 metres of drystone walling at Quarry Car Park: Cost: £4,860.
 - Installing new drainage at Baron Fields: Cost: £580.
 - Ash Cottage Picnic area on Higham Lane installing new steps: Cost: £600.
 - Lower Higham Visitor Centre installed new oak bench: Cost: £400.
 - Cow Lane path to the Cenotaph installed new wooden gate: Cost: £400.
 - Higham Lane dry stone walling repairs: Cost: £1,944.

All the above projects were funded by Tameside Council

- 1.4 During September and October work on installing a usable surface on the footpath and riding track along Werneth Low Road has been completed. Though the route is not within the official boundary of the Country Park the right of way links directly into it. The project also included path pitching, fencing, drystone walling, installing new gates and stiles. The total costs were £30,000. The project was funded by Tameside Council.
- 1.5 On 14 August, during the evening, a large number of stone flags were stolen from around the entrance to the Visitor Centre. The incident was reported to the Police but unfortunately there were two more thefts, at the same location, after that date. The cost of replacing the flags is £3,800 and is subject to an insurance claim by the Hyde War Memorial Trust.

2. ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP - HIGHER LEVEL AGREEMENT 2010 - 2020 UPDATE

- 2.1 Environmental Stewardship agreements have five primary objectives:-
 - Wildlife conservation
 - Maintenance and enhancement of landscape quality and character
 - Natural resource protection
 - Protection of the historic environment
 - Promotion of public access and understanding of the countryside

Environmental Stewardship – Higher Level agreements are only suitable for land that is of "significant environmental interest".

2.2 Since the agreement started in January 2010 the Country Park has received in total to date £42,420 of grant income from Natural England.

3. PUBLIC EVENTS

4. WERNETH LOW COUNTRY PARK GREENSPACE VOLUNTEER SERVICE

- 4.1 Since the last meeting of the Country Park Joint Management Committee the volunteers have held 2 meetings. The volunteers assist the Greenspace Development Officer with public events, the maintenance and general upkeep of sites and staffing the visitor centre. There are at present 16 members in the volunteer service.
- 4.2 The Greenspace Volunteers are very busy through the summer on a multitude of projects and none more important than the control of non-native invasive flowers. The main species is Himalayan Balsam, which if left unchecked will choke out native wildflowers. We monitor the amount of time site by site and record the data on a spreadsheet. This information is analysed at the end of the year, which enables us to decide the most important sites to attack the following year and to give an overall picture of the problem the Country Park faces from these dangerous weeds. The target spreadsheet and number of hours completed by the Volunteers for this year can be found in **Appendix 1**.
- 4.3 In 2007 the Country Park replaced all its post and wire stock proof fencing right across land belonging to both Tameside Council and the Hyde War Memorial Trust. This capital expenditure was secured by the Joint Committee from Council funds and the total cost for replacing 4,693 metres was £25,248. At this time suppliers of treated timbers had without consultation changed the chemicals of the timber preservation treatment. The outcome of this action has been the significant reduction in the viability of outdoor land management timbers such as post and wire fencing. Following a survey of the Country Park we are now in the process of replacing fencing posts the number of which amounts to many hundreds. This work is being undertaken by the Park's Volunteer Service.
- 4.4 At the September meeting of the Country Park Volunteers the list of work and wildlife nature conservation projects for the period October 2018 to April 2019 was discussed and agreed. We undertake this planning every year, which helps to monitor progress and gives direction to the work of the Volunteer Service. A copy of the project list can be found in **Appendix 2**.

5. SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE 11 NOVEMBER 2018

5.1 At the time of writing this report preparations are well underway for the 100th Anniversary of the 1918 Armistice, Service of Remembrance. Trustees of the Hyde War Memorial Trust have been working tirelessly in recent months to make all the necessary arrangements for this very special occasion.

6. THE LOWER HIGHAM VISITOR CENTRE

6.1 The number of visitors to Lower Higham is as follows:-

6.2 A defibrillator machine has been installed at Lower Higham Visitor Centre. The wall mounted security box containing the Defib is located next to the garage doors. Signs will be placed in notice boards around the Country Park informing visitors of its location. The person who installed and delivered the machine is organising a Defib training session for all Country Park staff.

7. WILDLIFE NATURE CONSERVATION

- 7.1 Once again Pink-footed geese have been seen flying high over Werneth Low on their annual migration south. These birds have been resting at Martin Mere on the Lancashire wetlands having left their summer breeding grounds in Greenland and Iceland. This autumn migration is one of the great wildlife spectacles in the North West and Werneth Low is a great place to watch it.
- 7.2 Other winter migrant birds seen around the Country Park recently include the Fieldfare and Redwing. These birds are from Northern Europe though occasionally they breed in the far north of Scotland. They are often seen stripping berries from the Park's Hawthorn trees and are a true sign that winter is on its way.
