14 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no declarations of interest.

15 APPLICATION TO VARY A PREMISES LICENCE – ASTLEY NEWS, 194 ASTLEY STREET, DUKINFIELD, SK16 4QD

Consideration was given to an application to vary a premises licence held by Astley News, 194 Astley Street, Dukinfield, SK16 4QD. Members of the Panel were informed that Tameside MBC's Licensing Authority, as a responsible authority, received an application to vary an existing premise licence at Astley News. The application sought to extend the terminal hour for the sale of alcohol and opening hours for the premises to 01:00am.

The Licensing Manager outlined the procedure and the steps which could be utilised by the Speakers Panel (Liquor Licensing) in determining the application. The Licensing Manager informed the panel that the application was submitted by the current Premises Licence Holder and Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS).

The Panel heard the applicant's statement outlining the request to vary the Premises Licence. The Applicant informed the Panel that customers had asked for the premises to open later and that there was potential for the premises to be successful operating until 01:00am as few shops operated until this time in the area.

Following this address all parties were afforded the opportunity to ask questions in relation to the statement.

The Chair of the Panel invited representations to be made starting with the Regulatory Compliance Officer on behalf of the Licensing Authority. The Regulatory Compliance Officer explained that the Licensing Authority had concerns over the time in which this premise wished to sell alcohol to members of the public. There were several other Off Licences in the nearby area which did not sell alcohol past 23:00, two of which were located on the same road. It was highlighted that on the application submitted, very little detail had been provided in the operating schedule to assure the Licensing Authority in respect of promoting the four licensing objectives. It was further explained that Astley News was located directly next door to the Chapel House Public House on Astley Street, Dukinfield. With a potential time of 01:00am for the sale of alcohol, this posed significant risk to patrons who had already been drinking in the Chapel House pub as they would be able to purchase more alcohol for consumption at home.

On behalf of Greater Manchester Police, PC Martin Thorley made representation. PC Thorley explained that there were several other Off Licences in the nearby area which do not sell alcohol past 23:00, two of which were located on Astley Street, Dukinfield. The Panel were advised that the application did not demonstrate the four licensing objectives in particular, reducing Crime and Disorder and preventing public Nuisance. PC Thorley explained that there would be an increase in

crime and disorder which could lead to further demands being placed onto Greater Manchester Police in the immediate area surrounding Astley News, particularly given that the area is predominately residential and nuisance complaints. The proposed license times had the potential to pose a significant risk to patrons who had already been drinking at the Chapel House pub as they and others would be able to purchase and consume more alcohol

The Public Health Consultant was then invited to make his representation. James Mallion informed Members of the Panel that the locality already had the 31st highest degree of existing alcohol related harm in the Borough, which fell in the top quartile. The rank for weekend A&E attendances (from midnight to 5am), was the 13th highest in the borough. It was explained that extending the opening hours posed a risk to the first three licensing objectives, prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; and prevention of public nuisance. It was further explained that the increased supply of alcohol could further increase the number of A&E attendances in the area that Astley News was within, the thirteenth highest in the Borough.

All parties were invited to provide a brief statement in summary, Members of the Panel carefully considered the written report, representations and the questions and answers during the hearing in addition to all of the information provided. The Panel determined that it would not be appropriate to approve the application. The Panel rejected the application on the grounds of prevention of crime and disorder and prevention of public nuisance.

RESOLVED

That the Application to Vary the Premises Licence ASTLEY NEWS, 194 ASTLEY STREET, DUKINFIELD, SK16 4QD be refused.

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Section 51(1) of the Licensing Act 2003 outlines the procedure whereby a responsible authority may apply to the Licensing Authority for a review of a premises licence.
- 1.2 Section 52(3) of the Licensing Act 2003 states that the Authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 1.3 The steps mentioned in subsection (4) are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence.

2. REPORT

- 2.1 The Royal Oak, 23 Nook Lane, Ashton under Lyne, has held a premises licence with this Authority since 24 November 2005. The premises licence holder is Admiral Taverns and the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) is Bernadette Corcoran, who has been in place at the premises since 9 April 2019. A copy of the premises licence is attached at **Appendix 1**.
- 2.2 Since May 2019, the Council's Regulatory Services Department has received 4 complaints from members of the public regarding disorder and anti-social behaviour associated with the premises. Details of these complaints are attached at **Appendix 2**.
- 2.3 On 25 June 2019 a compliance visit was conducted at the premises following receipt of a complaint that that licensable activities were being carried on beyond the authorised hours and that drugs were being openly used within the premises. At the time of the visit the DPS was unable to access the CCTV footage, concerns were raised with Admiral Taverns regarding the management of the premises and a further visit was arranged with Admiral Taverns Business Development Manager, Tony Sullivan.
- 2.4 On 10 July 2019, Licensing Officers met with Mr Sullivan at the premises to discuss the complaint and review the CCTV footage. Limited footage was provided which did not cover the times requested, however the footage supplied was sufficient to confirm that the sale of alcohol was taking place after licensable hours. Further, customers were also seen to be dealing drugs and smoking inside the premises.
- 2.5 Licensing Officers worked with Admiral Taverns to agree a list of conditions to be attached to the premises licence in an attempt to ensure that the licensing objectives were promoted. At this time Licensing Officers reiterated their concerns that the management of the premises were failing to address the issues identified at the premises. A minor variation application to attach the agreed conditions was submitted on 13 August 2019.
- 2.6 Since the premises licence was amended there have been further breaches of the licence, and the DPS has repeatedly failed to cooperate with the authorities following incidents.
- 2.7 On 28 November 2019, a meeting was arranged with the Licensing Manager, Police Licensing Officer, Regulatory Compliance Officer and Tony Sullivan to discuss the incidents. Mr Sullivan was informed that both the Police and Licensing department had lost faith in the ability of the DPS to effectively manage the premises and promote the licensing objectives. The Police Licensing Officer advised Mr Sullivan that if the DPS was not

removed from the premises then an application to review the premises licence would be submitted to the Licensing department.

- 2.8 Further incidents took place over the Christmas and New Year period demonstrating that the current DPS had lost control of the premises. Despite assurances from the premises licence holder, no application was received to change the Designated Premises Supervisor. As such an application to review the premises licence was submitted to the Licensing Authority by Greater Manchester Police on 6 January 2020. A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 3**.

3. REPRESENTATIONS & EVIDENCE SUBMITTED

- 3.1 In addition to the application to review the premises licence, a supporting statement and evidence bundle has been received from Martin Thorley, Police Licensing Officer on behalf of Greater Manchester Police. This statement is attached at **Appendix 4**.
- 3.2 A representation has been received from Ian Pascoe, Regulatory Compliance Officer on behalf of the Licensing Authority. This representation is attached at **Appendix 5**.
- 3.3 A representation has been received from James Mallion, Consultant Public Health on behalf of Public Health. This representation is attached at **Appendix 6**.
- 3.4 A representation has been received from a member of the public who lives in close proximity to the premises. This is attached at **Appendix 7**.

4. HOME OFFICE GUIDANCE

- 4.1 The current guidance issued by the Home Office under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 deals with the Powers of a Licensing Authority on the determination of a review, with particular attention being drawn to section 11.19, where a Licensing Authority considers action under its statutory powers:

11.19 Where the licensing authority considers that action under its statutory powers is appropriate, it may take any of the following steps:

- *modify the conditions of the premises licence (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;*
- *exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);*
- *remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;*
- *suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;*
- *revoke the licence.*

5. CONCLUSION AND OPTIONS FOR THE PANEL

- 5.1 Panel are requested to consider the evidence and decide what (if any) steps to take as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The options available to the Panel are;
- a) Take no action
 - b) to modify the conditions of the licence;
 - c) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;

- d) to remove the designated premises supervisor;
- e) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding 3 months;
- f) to revoke the licence

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**All supplies of alcohol**

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Exhibition of films

1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.

3. Where:

(a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

In this section children means any person aged under 18; and film classification body means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

Door supervision

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:

(a) Be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or

(b) Be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.

But nothing in subsection 1 requires such a condition to be imposed:

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

(b) in respect of premises in relation to:

(i) Any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising films or under a gaming licence, or

(ii) Any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.

For the purposes of this section:

(a) security activity means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act,

(b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Age verification policy

1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

2. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

Irresponsible drinks promotions

1. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-

- (a) Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) Selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (e) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Alcoholic drink measures

The responsible person must ensure that-

- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Cost of Alcohol

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

For the purposes of the condition

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) or agent of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
Where the permitted price given by the calculation is not a whole number of pennies, the price given by that calculation shall be taken to be the price rounded up to the nearest penny.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, e):

The licensing objectives have been carefully considered in the light of the proposed variation taking account of the premises and their location.

The proposed variation will not alter the style and operation of the premises.

The proposed variation will promote the licensing objectives in accordance with the Section 182 Guidance.

The premises will operate in accordance with all relevant legislation.

Details of any additional measures considered necessary to promote the licensing objectives are contained under the relevant objective below.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder:

Crime and disorder objective has been considered in the light of the proposed variation.

The proposed variation will not alter the style and operation of the premises and will not have an adverse effect on the crime and disorder objective.

The proposed variation will promote the crime and disorder objective in accordance with the Section 182 Guidance

The premises will continue to operate in accordance with all relevant legislation which promotes the crime and disorder objective.

The premises will liaise and co-operate with the police and participate in any Pub Watch or other equivalent scheme.

A proof of age policy will operate in relation to relevant licensable activities.

A zero tolerance towards illegal drugs will operate at all times.

Any drinks promotions will not adversely affect the promotion of responsible drinking. Customers will be encouraged to leave the premises in a quiet and orderly manner.

Staff will be trained to observe the measures necessary to promote the crime and disorder objective.

A CCTV system will operate during the hours when licensable activities are provided. Intercom in bar.

c) Public safety

Public safety objective has been considered in the light of the proposed variation.

The proposed variation will not alter the style and operation of the premises and will not have an adverse affect on the public safety objective.

The proposed variation will promote the public safety objective in accordance with the Section 182 Guidance.

The premises will operate in accordance with all relevant legislation which promotes the public safety objective including, but not limited to, the Health & Safety At Work etc Act 1974 and associated regulations, the Food Safety Act 1990, the Fire Precautions (Workplace) Regulations 1997 and the Disability Discrimination Act 1975.

2 CCTV

This check must include the operation of the cameras, the recording facilities, the facilities for providing footage and the accuracy of the time & date. A written record of these checks must be kept, including a signature of the person carrying out the check. This written record must be kept on the premises at all times and made available to a representative of any responsible authority on request.

(g) Suitable signage informing customers that a CCTV system is in operation must be placed in prominent positions within the premises, including information on the Data Protection Act and the Human Rights act.

3 Drug Policy

The management of the premises must introduce a strict "zero tolerance" policy in respect of the use and/or supply of illegal drugs on the premises. The policy to include checks of the toilet areas every half-hour whilst the premises are open and suitable signage to be placed in prominent areas within the premises.

4 Incident Book

An incident book (with the pages numbered sequentially) must be kept on the premises and be made available for inspection by responsible authorities and must be used to record the following:

- i. Any incident of violence or disorder on or immediately outside the premises.
- ii. Any incident involving controlled drugs (supply, possession / influence) on the premises.

- iii. Any other crime or criminal activity on the premises.
- iv. Any refusal to serve alcohol to persons who are drunk (on sale and off sale premises only).
- v. Any refusal to serve alcohol to under 18s.
- vi. Any call for police assistance to the premises.
- vii. Any ejection from the premises.
- viii. Any first aid / other care given to a customer.

5 Prevention Of Noise Breakout

(j) Doors & Windows

To prevent noise nuisance, all windows and doors at the premise must be kept closed at any time when regulated entertainment, live music (amplified or unamplified), recorded music or any other type of entertainment (amplified or unamplified) is being performed at the premise, except to allow people to enter or exit.

(ii) Noise from Premises

No noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises that gives rise to a nuisance.

(iii) Noise Checks

While live or recorded music takes place the Licensee or Management shall undertake regular monitoring of noise levels at the nearest noise sensitive locations. A record shall be kept of any monitoring including the date, time and location, the name of the monitor and any action taken. Records shall be kept for no less than 6 months and shall be made available upon request by any local authority officers or Greater Manchester Police.

6 Notices to Customers

Notices requesting customers to leave quietly must be displayed in a prominent position next to each entrance/exit. The Designated Premises Supervisor must ensure that customers are encouraged to keep noise to a minimum when leaving the premise.

7 Challenge 25

The premises must operate a "Challenge 25" scheme at the premise in relation to age verification for alcohol sales and other age-restricted products. Signs and/or posters must be displayed in prominent positions inside the premise to inform customers of this condition.

8 Staff Training

i. Any staff employed at the premises will receive training by the Designated Premises Supervisor on first appointment and at least every three months thereafter. Training will include input on preventing underage sales, sales of alcohol to people who are drunk, application of the drugs policy and any other relevant matters.

ii. A written record will be kept of all training carried out. This record must be kept on the premises and made available for inspection by any responsible authority.

9 List of Authorised Persons

The Designated Premises Supervisor must maintain a written record of all members of staff who are authorised to sell alcohol. This record must include a photograph of the relevant members of staff to be kept on the premises at all times and be made available to a representative of any responsible authority on request.







The **Royal Oak** is a public house situated at Hurst Cross, on the B6194. The **Royal Oak** is a small public house which has both a vault and bar and trading room. The premise has a car park and beer garden facility to the right hand side. It has main entrance/exits on to the pavement at the front of the premises. There is also an entrance/exit onto the car park at the side of the pub. The B6194 is a busy thoroughfare between Ashton under Lyne and Oldham.

On today's date I can confirm that the Premises Licence Holder is Admiral Taverns Piccadilly Limited. The Designated Premises Supervisor is Bernadette Corcoran who took over this position from 9th April 2019 from the previous DPS who was Lisa Jane Todd.

I have previously visited the premises on occasions in company with TMBC Officers Louise Ashton and Ian Pascoe where compliance and licensing checks have been conducted.

On 21st November 2019 whilst liaising with Police Officers and Police Community Support Officers who cover the area of Hurst Cross and St Michaels, I was informed of concerns which the local offices had about incidents which had occurred outside the Royal Oak Public House. I was informed that an overt Public Facing TMBC camera situated at Hurst Cross, Ashton under Lyne had captured incidents from 10th October 2019, 11th October 2019 and 18th October 2019. This recorded footage was forwarded to local Police and was exhibited accordingly. This footage show the following:-

10th October 2019

23.16hrs Male customer from the Royal Oak is seen to urinate against the front of the Pub, before returning to the front door of the pub, spitting on the doorstep and returning inside the Pub.

11th October 2019

23.00.42hrs Male wearing baseball cap is seen to be holding a small snap bag and is seen to flick the bag before snorting the content. I believe that this behaviour is consistent with taking illegal drugs.

23.00.52hrs Male in Baseball Cap is seen to deal to male wearing a black coloured coat

23.01.11hrs Male wearing black coloured coat appears to place a key inside the bag before snorting the contents from the key. I believe that this behaviour is consistent with taking illegal drugs.

23.10.59hrs A gentleman who is unsteady on his feet is walking past the front of the Pub. He struggles to pass no fewer than eleven patrons from the premises who are drinking alcohol and smoking on the public footpath, obstructing the footpath.

23.15hrs Group of males are in possession of glasses, drinking alcohol outside the premises. It is only when a female who is believed to be a member of staff from the Royal Oak comes out that the group return inside the premises.

18th October 2019

22.22.30hrs The DPS Bernadette Corcoran is observed smoking a cigarette whilst stood outside the front door of the premises. At this time a vehicle leaves the car park and drives off towards Queens Road / Hurst Cross. The vehicle is seen to pull up at the Automatic Traffic Signals. At this point the Driver is seen to be inhaling and exhaling from a yellow balloon. The front seat passenger is inflating another yellow balloon, via a container. This is consistent with inflating the balloon with Nitrous oxide (laughing gas) and then inhaling it to get a high.

On Thursday 28th November 2019 Tony Sullivan attended the Licensing Office at TMBC, Tame Street, Stalybridge. Also present in this meeting was Ian Pascoe, Regulatory Compliance Officer and Mike Robinson, Licensing Manager. During this meeting the above footage was played in the presence of Tony Sullivan. Mr Sullivan was informed of my lack of confidence in the ability of the DPS to effectively manage the premises. Mr Sullivan acknowledged that the premises were causing concerns and that he intended to take steps to replace the current DPS.

On Wednesday 4th December 2019 I wrote to Tony Sullivan of Admiral Taverns informing him of my concerns about the DPS' ability to effectively manage the licensed premises I informed Mr Sullivan of my feelings that it is proportionate for me to consider sending representation on behalf of Greater Manchester Police to Tameside MBC in relation to the Licensing Objectives, under prevention of Crime and Disorder, if no further action was taken by Admiral Taverns.

On Wednesday 4th December 2019 Mr Sullivan replied to my email stating the following:-

"Thank you for your email. What I didn't say in my previous email was that I told Bernadette last Friday that I am looking to replace her asap. And with this in mind I would confirm that I'm interviewing for the Royal Oak next Tuesday / Wednesday and hope to have a replacement in place asap. I hope this meets with your approval."

Despite the above, the DPS has remained in place at the Royal Oak Public House and I have been made aware of two further incidents of violence occurring, both inside and outside the Royal Oak Public House. No calls were received by Greater Manchester Police from the management of the Royal Oak Public House. Both incidents were captured by the overt Public Facing TMBC camera situated at Hurst Cross, Ashton under Lyne.

On 27th December 2019 I received notification from TMBC CCTV that on Thursday 26th December at approximately 22:30hrs an argument broke out outside the pub. About half a dozen people were involved in the argument. Cars had to swerve around them. At one point a female can be seen hitting the bonnet of a vehicle (not involved). It's possible the offenders left in vehicles parked on Nook Lane. When police arrived patrons denied anything had taken place.

As a result of this incident I contacted Bernadette Corcoran at 11.21hrs on 31st December 2019. I left a detailed message requesting CCTV footage from inside the Royal Oak.

At 09.58hrs on 1st January 2020 I received notification from TMBC CCTV of another incident at the Royal Oak Public House which occurred in the early hours of New Year's Day. A male enters the pub approx. 02:00hrs, within a minute he is escorted out by the Landlady. A male then appears from the pub with a cut to his head. No altercation caught on TMBC camera. The incident happened inside the pub.

As a result of this incident I emailed Tony Sullivan at 08.40hrs on 2nd January 2020 informing him of the incidents on Boxing Day and in the early hours of New Year's Day. I again reiterated my concerns with regards to the ability of the DPS to promote the Licensing Objectives and her failure to provide requested CCTV from the incidents.

Mr Sullivan responded to the email detailing accounts from the DPS and stating that CCTV was to be made available by the DPS.

At 12.26hrs on Friday 3rd January Bernadette Corcoran (DPS) telephoned me to say that footage had been down loaded and was ready for collection from the Royal Oak. At 13.15hrs I attended in company with Ian Pascoe and we viewed the footage via the CCTV monitor within the living accommodation at the Pub. This footage captured incidents at the premises though the footage was 1 hr and 7 minutes out. At the time of viewing the CCTV the time was actually 14.22hrs and the CCTV was showing 15.22hrs. During this visit I was shown the incident book in relation to these incidents which I took copies of.

Despite being provided with a memory stick by the DPS, this memory stick only showed 15 different captures of footage. None of these showed the two incidents I had requested.

I informed Tony Sullivan of the failure of the DPS to provide the required footage at 15.16hrs on 14th January 2020 via email.

On 17th January 2020 Ian Pascoe from TMBC collected the memory stick from the DPS at the premises. On reviewing the memory stick it was discovered that the contents of the devise again did not contain all the requested footage and only showed the incident from New Year's Day.

At 13.12hrs on Monday 20th January 2020 I emailed Tony Sullivan requesting the footage from 26th December 2019. Mr Sullivan replied confirming that he had previously requested the footage from the DPS.

At 13.00hrs on Wednesday 22nd January 2020 I received a telephone call from Bernadette informing me that the footage was ready for collection. I immediately attended at the Royal Oak and collected the additional memory stick containing the footage.

The licence for the Royal Oak states that Recorded Footage must be provided to a representative of any responsible authority on request. Such footage must be provided in an immediately viewable format and must include any software etc. which is required to view the footage. The provision of the wrong footage and having to wait from 31st December when I first requested the footage until 22nd January 2020 (22 days later), demonstrates the inability of the DPS to conform to the conditions detailed in the Licence.

Having received all the requested footage I reviewed the footage from the Royal Oak Public House and I logged the incidents from both the Pub and Council CCTV. This footage showed the following:-

26th December 2019

***23.59.51hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Argument in Vault on premises between patrons.***

***23.32.50hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Member of staff removes two males and one female from premises following argument in the vault.***

***23.33.35hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Ejected female attempts to move 'A' board from the front of the premises.***

***23.33.54hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Ejected female throws mobile telephone at window of Public House.***

***23.34.00hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Two males who were sat inside the Royal Oak close to the window where the mobile telephone was thrown at come out of the Pub and confront the three ejected persons. Fighting in the street then follows with seven persons being involved.***

***22.28.20hrs
Council CCTV captures the disorder and fighting on the street following the argument in the vault.
Police Officers are called by TMBC CCTV Operators.
Two Police cars and one Police Van attend, arriving to a grade one incident, using full emergency equipment.
Police arrive at 22.28.22hrs***

1st January 2020

***03.11.48hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
CCTV Footage shows male wearing white sweater arriving at the Royal Oak and entering for the first time with a female.***

***03.11.54hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Male in white sweater enters the Royal Oak Vault and greets male in dark clothing with a handshake.
DPS is present and does not appear concerned with the presence of the males.***

***03.12.29hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Male in white sweater starts to argue with male who is playing pool***

***03.12.48hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)
Male in white sweater throws glass towards the male playing pool. The glass strikes the head of the male he had previously greeted wearing dark clothing. The glass causes a cut to right side of his face/ head.***

03.12.58hrs (Royal Oak CCTV is 1 hr 7 mins in front of correct time)

Male in white sweater is escorted from the premises by the DPS who is seen to remonstrate and point her finger at the offender who walks off towards Oldham.

02.03.40hrs Council CCTV picks up the male in white sweater (offender) arriving at the Royal Oak. The male appears agitated and argues at the door.

02.04.04hrs Male in white sweater (offender) enters the Pub. The DPS is seen to be present and allows the male to enter the Premises.

02.05.18hrs Male in white sweater (offender) leaves the Royal Oak via the front door and is seen to walk off with a female towards Oldham. At this time the DPS is seen on the footage appearing to point at the offender.

02.06.20hrs There is footage of an argument at the front door of the premises, The DPS is taken inside the pub by her partner

02.09hrs Two males walk away from the Pub. Front Door is closed and CCTV Footage concludes.

On Tuesday 11th February I was notified of an incident which occurred outside the Royal Oak in which a female had reported being assaulted. The victim claims that she was with friends who were intoxicated and the offender who was heavily intoxicated, to the point where he is struggling to stand. Because of his level of drunkenness the offender had begun causing a commotion in the house, including damaging a few plates through clumsiness. The group then decide to go to a nearby public house, the Royal Oak, despite AP's reservations, where they all continue to drink. The group are seen on CCTV outside the front door of the pub, standing on the pavement, smoking cigarettes before a fight breaks out. The victim attempts to intervene and calm the situation and claims she is physically grabbed hold of and shoved her away using a great deal of force. The victim falls to the floor quite severely, and as a result injures her right leg and right forearm. Her forearm is later found to have been fractured in two places, and her leg is heavily grazed and badly bruised.

On 13th February 2020 I checked the Greater Manchester Police Computer System for incidents at both the Royal Oak Public House and 23 Nook Lane Ashton under Lyne. Since 6th June 2019 there have been two reported incidents.

I believe the DPS has failed to demonstrate her ability to promote the Licensing Objectives at the premises. Incidents captured on both Royal Oak CCTV and TMBC CCTV systems evidence that there are incidents of Crime and Disorder occurring at The Royal Oak which are not being managed effectively by the DPS, Bernadette Corcoran. The footage shows incidents, arguments and assaults inside the premises are detected and acknowledged. The footage also evidences that these same incidents, which the DPS is aware of, are allowed to spill outside the premises without any attempt to dissuade other patrons from exiting the Premises for the sole purpose of committing crime and disorder. The footage also shows that there are incidents occurring outside the premises which are ignored by staff from the Royal Oak.

It causes me concern that on the occasions when it is clear that the DPS, her partner and her staff are aware of assaults occurring both on and off the premises that there have been no calls made to Police to report such matters. No attempt is made to prevent patrons walking freely to and from the premises in possession of alcoholic drinks and glasses. It is evident that patrons from the Royal Oak are responsible for this disorder and the subsequent injuries.

At 12.00hrs on Friday 24th January a meeting was convened at TMBC Tame Street, Stalybridge with Tony Sullivan, Business Development Manager with Admiral Taverns, Ian Pascoe, Regulatory Compliance Officer TMBC and I. Incidents at the premises were openly discussed.

During this meeting I recommended Licensing Conditions to be volunteered to the Licence of The Royal Oak by the Premise Licence Holder. This request was proposed in order for the premises to comply with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and to ensure promotion of the licensing objectives for Prevention of crime and disorder and Public safety. It is suggested that the appropriate and proportionate way to deal with these incidents that have occurred is the modification of conditions of the licence and implementation of the following Licensing Conditions:-

1. The implementation of SIA 'Approved' Doorstaff working Friday – Saturday between 2100hrs – ½ hour after closing time. One member of Doorstaff within these times and for any sporting event being shown on the premises.
2. CCTV will be improved covering each entry and exit point of the premises and the car park.
3. Smoking to only be permitted in the car park / beer garden
4. No glass to be taken beyond the front entrance to the premises.
5. Sale of alcohol to conclude at midnight – Sunday – Thursday
0100hrs Friday – Saturday

The recommended Licensing Conditions in relation to Doorstaff were dismissed by Tony Sullivan as unachievable.

At 09.00hrs on Tuesday 28th January I attended at Stretford Police Station in possession of GMP Property Reference Number GG/004778/20 which contained 3 TMBC Disks and 2 Memory Stick from the Royal Oak. GMP CCTV retrieval Officer Elena Samson produced a compilation of incident from the Royal Oak which are to be made available in relation to the Review of Premises Licence.

It is evident that The Royal Oak, 23 Nook Lane, Ashton under Lyne has been associated with incidents of crime and disorder for at least the past six months. Incidents which are directly related to the premises are impacting on residents from the local community including patrons from the premises fighting on the street and patrons from the pub drug taking on the street whilst consuming alcohol purchased from the Royal Oak.

It is also suggested that the manner in which the premises have been managed, allowing the congregation of patrons outside the premises has led to incidents of alcohol and drug fuelled crime and disorder where patrons of the premises, staff and members of the public are in danger of being subjected to unlawful violence. The knock on effect of the continued and frequent incidents at the premises is having a detrimental effect on the quality of life of the residents who live in the vicinity of The Royal Oak Public House.

To the best of my knowledge and belief there is no reasonable ground for believing that the information produced above, from various Police computer systems, and included in this statement is inaccurate.

As a result of the above information I applied for a review of the Premises Licence for The Royal Oak, 23 Nook Lane, Ashton under Lyne, Denton on the grounds of **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety**. This application was dated Monday 6th January 2020.





The Licensing Authority, in its capacity as a 'Responsible Authority' under the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, hereby give notice of our representation in relation to a review of the premises licence in respect of the above premises.

The reason(s) for the representation are as follows:

I wish to make a representation in relation to a review of the premises licence as I believe that the following licensing objectives have seriously been undermined:

Prevention of crime and disorder
Prevention of public nuisance
Public Safety

On 25th June 2019 a compliance visit was undertaken at the premises by Regulatory Compliance Officer, Louise Ashton following complaints received of drinking beyond the licensable hours, drug taking inside the premises and noise. There were some issues regarding non-compliance regarding toilet checks, (the toilet check log had not been completed since 10th June), refusals book and staff training.

The DPS Bernadette Corcoran was unable to download any footage of the night in question and there were no devices present to download any footage to. The DPS was advised to get the footage downloaded as soon as possible and contact Louise when it was available.

On 27th June, Louise emailed Darren Kelly from Admiral Taverns to inform him of the complaint and that the footage from the CCTV still hadn't been received, despite numerous attempts by Louise and another officer to obtain it.

A meeting was arranged with Tony Sullivan from Admiral Taverns and Louise for the 10th July 2019, at the premises. At the meeting the DPS provided limited footage of what was requested, however the footage obtained from 2nd June-3rd June evidenced two customers openly smoking at 01.29am in the premises, the DPS still serving alcohol at 02.02am and the money going in the till at 02.04am, breaching the hours of licensable activities and what looked to be an exchange of drugs taking place between customers.

These concerns were raised by Louise to Mike Robinson (Licensing Manager) who advised Louise to contact Admiral and ask them to submit a Minor Variation to make the conditions more stringent and consistent with Tameside Licensing Policy.

Louise emailed Rebecca Farley at Admiral Taverns reiterating her concerns regarding how the premises is being run and attached the proposed conditions for the minor variation.

On 13th August 2019 the application was received by licensing with the agreed conditions attached.

Following further incidents of disorder which has been captured on the CCTV footage provided by P.C Martin Thorley, more visits were made to the premise and requests for CCTV footage were made, not once has the CCTV footage been readily available, when it has been provided it has not been the footage that we have asked for, meaning further revisits required to obtain the correct footage.

On Thursday 28th November 2019, a meeting with me, Tony Sullivan, PC Martin Thorley and Mike Robinson was held at Tame Street Stalybridge, the footage of the latest incidents which took place on 10th October and the 11th October were played.

Tony Sullivan acknowledged that the premise was causing problems and that steps would be taken to relieve the current DPS of her duties.

Further incidents occurred over the Christmas and New Year period which are documented below which demonstrated that Admiral was failing in their duty to promote the licensing objectives.

26th December 2019:

Issues with patrons of the premises, arguing in the premises, this then continues on the highway outside which escalates in to fighting.

This incident was captured by TMBC CCTV.

1st January 2020 :

Incident occurred where a customer of the premise is glassed following an altercation inside.

This follows with arguing outside the premises.

I feel that if the review wasn't submitted by PC Thorley the DPS would still be running the premises and the licensing objectives would not be adhered to.

At the time of writing this representation the current DPS is still at the premises, I feel that there is significant risk of further incidents occurring under the current management who have failed to promote the licensing objectives

I, James Mallion on behalf of Public Health in their capacity as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 make representation in relation to the premises licence review at (On License) Royal Oak, Nook Lane, Ashton-under-Lyne, OL6 9HN submitted to the Licensing Authority on 7 January 2020.

In relation to the above application, I have enclosed some information and comments below.

The representation relates primarily to: the prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; and the prevention of public nuisance.

The attached document in Appendix 1 is a letter outlining our findings including the evidence and data behind this in relation to the existing level of alcohol-related harm in the area.

See below a screenshot of the data for this area (OL6 9HN) which indicates the level of existing alcohol-related harm. The overall score at the bottom is made up of the 6 individual indicators, which gives an overall picture of alcohol-related harm in the Lower Super Output Area (LSOA). This tells us that this area has the 34th highest degree of existing alcohol-related harm in the borough (out of 141 LSOAs), which falls into the top quintile. Of particular note in the individual indicators: the rank for weekend alcohol-related A&E attendances (from midnight to 5am) in this area is 3rd highest in the borough (out of 141 LSOAs), and more than double the Tameside average; and the rank for all alcohol-specific hospital admissions in this area is 6th highest in the borough (out of 141 LSOAs), and four times higher than the Tameside average. That means that, compared to the rest of the borough, there are already high numbers of people from this area admitted to hospital for issues directly linked to alcohol consumption, and attending A&E overnight at the weekend due to alcohol. The overall rate of alcohol-related crime in this area is also high and ranked 9th highest in the borough.

More detailed analysis of healthcare data shows that between January 2018 and November 2019 there have been a number of A&E attendances where the location of the incidents were identified as being within the vicinity of OL6 9HN. These incidents included

- 9 alcohol related A&E attendances-mainly intoxication and mental and behaviour issues relating to alcohol
- 12 drug related A&E attendances-mainly mental and behavioural issues relating to substance misuse.
- 3 domestic assault related A&E attendances
- 16 physical assault related A&E attendances

Based on this information I think it is appropriate to review the license for these premises as the evidence we have indicates that there is a high degree of existing alcohol-related harm in this area. Also given the further information relating to A&E attendances in the vicinity of the premises, I would recommend reviewing the conditions of this license, for example the hours of operation that they are permitted to remain open and serve alcohol.

Introduction

As a Responsible Body under the 2003 Licensing Act, the Population Health Team at Tameside Council would like to raise a representation as part of the review of the Royal Oak, Nook Lane, Ashton under Lyne, OL6 9HN

The representation primarily relates to:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance

Our Approach

The Population Health Team at Tameside Council has begun screening every new licence application or application for a licence review/variation against a series of measures to enable the identification of applications that could have a significant adverse impact on the local community.

This screening is undertaken through a locally developed triage toolkit and ranks the 141 Lower Super Output Areas (LSOA's) in Tameside against a number of Alcohol Harm indicators and then provides an overall ranking.

The rankings are underpinned by robust official data sets as follows:

- Density of Licensed Premises – Tameside Council information as of Dec 2019
- Alcohol Related Hospital Admissions –3 year period 1st Jan 2017 to 31st Dec 2019
- Weekend A&E Attendances between 0000hrs and 0500hrs – Tameside ICFT, Statistics for the 1 year period 1st Jan 2019 to 31st Dec 2019.

- Alcohol Related Crime – Greater Manchester Police data from 1st July 2018 until 30th June 2019.
- Alcohol Related Domestic Violence - Greater Manchester Police data from 1st July 2018 until 30th June 2019.
- Alcohol related Anti-Social Behaviour Incidents - Greater Manchester Police data from 1st July 2018 until 30th June 2019.

A decision has been made to make a representation in relation to this specific review as it has an overall weighted ranking as being **34th out of 141 LSOAs for alcohol related harm within the Tameside area and has significantly high levels of alcohol related weekend A&E attendances, hospital admissions and alcohol related crime.**

Alcohol Harm in relation to OL6 9HN (LSOA E01005935)

Tameside has some of the highest levels of Alcohol-related Harm in England.

The levels of existing Alcohol-related harm in this LSOA within which sits OL6 9HN are within the top 30% quintile with overall high levels of alcohol harm compared to other LSOAs within Tameside.

In this LSOA there are currently 2 on licensed premises. This means that it has low density of on licensed premises with 3.3 licensed premises per 1000 residents.

The rate of alcohol related A&E attendances in this LSOA is the 3rd highest out of 141 Tameside LSOAs and in 2018/19 the ***rate of alcohol related A&E attendances was more than twice as high as the Tameside average.***

The rate of alcohol specific hospital admissions in this area was the 6th highest out of 141 LSOAs in Tameside in 2018/19 the ***rate of alcohol specific hospital admissions was significantly worse at 4 times higher than the Tameside average.***

Alcohol related crime in this LSOA is 9th highest in the borough with alcohol related domestic assaults being the 15th highest in the borough out of 141 LSOA areas. ***The rate of alcohol related crime is significantly higher than the Tameside average***

Conclusion

Overall, we have assessed this LSOA within which OL6 9HN sits, as having very high levels of alcohol-related harm for both health and crime. The review of this premises needs to consider this harm to individual health and that of the local population and consider the impact on local health services, in particular the local A&E department as well as that of the local police and community safety resource.

Between January 2018 and November 2019 there have been a number of A&E attendances where the location of the incidents were identified as being within the vicinity of OL6 9HN. These incidents included

- 9 alcohol related A&E attendances-mainly intoxication and mental and behaviour issues relating to alcohol
- 12 drug related A&E attendances-mainly mental and behavioural issues relating to substance misuse.
- 3 domestic assault related A&E attendances
- 16 physical assault related A&E attendances

The evidence would suggest that it is appropriate for public health to submit this representation in support of the application to review this premises licence as the following licensing objectives have been undermined;

- **the prevention of crime and disorder**
- **public safety**
- **the prevention of public nuisance**
