

Background

- The Lung Health Check Programme is an integral part of the NHS Cancer Programme which aims to:
 - Prevent cancer
 - 2. More people surviving longer
 - 3. Improved experience of treatment and care for people with cancer
 - 4. Improved quality of life for people with cancer
- Each cancer alliance has received funding for one Clinical Commissioning group (CCG) to deliver a programme over four years as part of a "Targeted Lung Cancer Screening" programme.
- Tameside & Glossop CCG has been selected as one of the funded CCG's and is working in partnership with the Integrated Care Trust and the Council to roll out a LHC service for the local population

Life Expectancy Gap



EARLY DIAGNOSIS

 Patients diagnosed early have the best chance of long-term survival.



• At present, just over 50 per cent (53.7%) of staged cancers are diagnosed at stages one and two.



• Three in four cancers (75%) will be diagnosed at an early stage.



Targeted Lung Health Check Programme

- •The targeted lung health check (LHC) programme selects participants from a local population at high risk of lung cancer and offers low dose computed tomography (LDCT) to eligible subjects.
- The programme will cover participants aged between 55 and 74yrs, registered with a GP practice who have ever smoked
- Those who attend will be assessed to calculate their individual risk of developing lung cancer.
- To be rolled out across neighbourhoods from October 2019.
- Currently engaging with professionals involved in lung health, patients and residents on our preferred model of delivery

WHAT YOU'LL GET

First you'll be asked some questions about your breathing and how you feel to find out about your overall lung health.

Then by blowing into a machine, you'll be told whether there are any problems that need taking care of.

The nurse may also talk to you about having a lung scan to check for any early signs of lung cancer.

You can decide about this on the day or later.

You'll have plenty of time to chat to the nurse and ask any questions.

Bring a friend, family member or partner with you on the day if you want to.

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

Engagement so far....what's important?

- A neighbourhood model with both initial appointments and CT scans in the community
- Ensuring local people are included to develop information and materials which will improve equal access.
- A lung cancer awareness-raising campaign running alongside lung health checks will ensure a more equitable and wide reaching benefit.
- Smoking cessation advice is part of the offer are available on-site to deliver immediate counselling, backed up by access to medication and ongoing support where the patient wants it.
- Professionals delivering lung health checks have the knowledge and skills to discuss issues of concern for attendees, and are able to make referrals to support services such as social prescribing
- All information, written or verbal, must be clear and easily understood.
