

Dear Mike,

I, James Mallion on behalf of Public Health in their capacity as a Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 make representation in relation to the premises licence variation application at 194 Astley Street, Dukinfield submitted the Licensing Authority on 31 October 2019

In relation to the above application, I have enclosed some information and comments below.

See below a screenshot of the data for this area (SK16 4QD) which indicates the level of existing alcohol-related harm. The overall score at the bottom is made up of the 6 individual indicators, which gives an overall picture of alcohol-related harm in the LSOA. This tells us that this area has the 31st highest degree of existing alcohol-related harm in the borough (out of 141 LSOAs), which falls into the top quartile. Of particular note in the individual indicators, is the rank for Weekend A&E attendances (from midnight to 5am), for which this area is 13th highest in the borough (out of 141 LSOAs). That means they already have high numbers of people from this area attending A&E overnight at the weekend, and evidence shows a significant proportion of these will be alcohol-related.

Based on this information, I think extending the opening hours and supply of alcohol from this premises, particularly given the times of night involved and the proximity to existing licensed premises poses a risk to the first three licensing objectives (prevention of crime and disorder; public safety; and prevention of public nuisance). The most direct link I would like to identify is the high level of weekend night-time A&E attendances in this area, and the times at which this variation is proposing to extend the sale of alcohol (22:00-01:00 Mon-Sat; and 21:30-01:00 Sun), which may pose risks to public safety and increase the risk of public nuisance.
