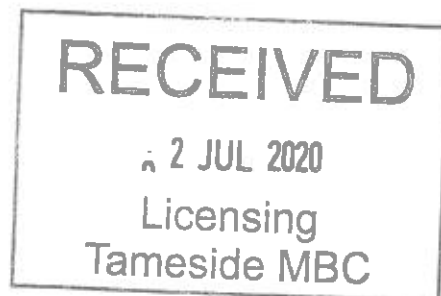

I write to object to the "Bingo premises application" from Casino Gaming Ltd, for Marker Slots, in unit 8 and 9 Drayden Shopping Centre.

The application states "new Bingo premises" but from the submitted plans it is clearly a "slot machine arcade" I believe it to be wholly inappropriate application for a shopping precinct. The precinct is a pathway to several local junior schools who's pupils use it constantly.

I believe it will act as a magnet for children to gather there.

We have on regular occasions had had to call the police to intervene, when youths have been seen breaking onto the Concorde Suite from the rear roof area, again I believe this kind of development would exacerbate this behaviour, I would also point out there are 2 bookmakers within 50 yards of this application. I also note the applicant is asking for opening hours from 9am until midnight, I would suggest this is totally wrong for a shopping precinct.

The application is for Premises in Droylsden Shopping Centre Unit 8 and 9.

I am concerned firstly about the young people of Droylsden who have for many years have been hanging about the Shopping Centre getting into the first floor of the Concord Building climbing breaking into the Concord and some of the shops. Having organized a Youth Club for a number of years I have had to contact the Police many times because of the Problems in the Shopping Centre and on the Metro link. The Walkway through the Centre is a pathway going and coming from School in the area. My Concern is Gambling Premises like the Casino will encourage young people gambling and loitering, and as on many occasions Drug abuse.

The lighting in the Shopping Centre goes off at 11pm. The Premises referred to as being open late are all on the Outskirts of the Town Centre e.g. Knapp Head, Bee Meive, Silly Country. They are not in the internal part of the Shopping Centre, The Shops are all closed at 5-30pm.

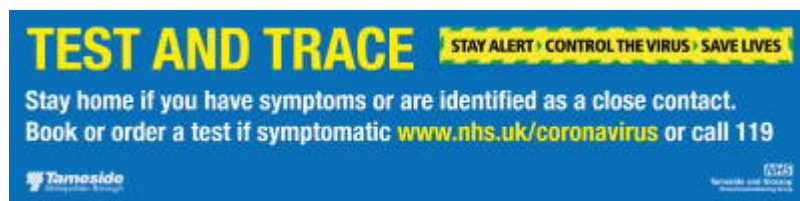
